Funds came from a National Board that is chaired by the US Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency.  6) If they are a private voluntary organization, they must have a voluntary board

Bids tendered to any other County personnel, elected official, County Counsel or other County agent will not qualify as valid bids. At the end of each day the highest bid amount received will be posted on the County's website (www.co.wallowa.or.us) and at the Board of Commissioners, with no identifying information as to the bidder's identity. The bidding will start at \$500,000.00 minimum bid. Bids below that amount will be rejected. The properties will be sold as a single lot, and not by individual tax lot. Bidders must bid on all parcels as a single lot. Upon close of bidding the successful bidder will be notified by telephone, and thereafter in writing. Wallowa County reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids. A nonrefundable deposit in the amount of 10% of the total bid must be delivered to Wallowa County and an earnest money agreement setting out the terms of sale must be signed by the winning bidder not later than 24 hours after close of bidding. Failure to do so will result in the bid being rejected and the next highest bid being accepted. The purchase of the subject property must close not later than 120 days after bid is accepted. No extensions will be granted under any circumstances. Should the sale not close in that time frame, the deposit will be forfeited, and the property made available for purchase by the next highest bidder. 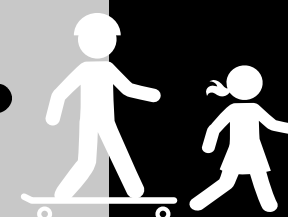
