MCMINNVILLE — Linfield claimed its second straight Northwest Conference softball championship Sunday, defeating Whitworth 5-1 in the title game.

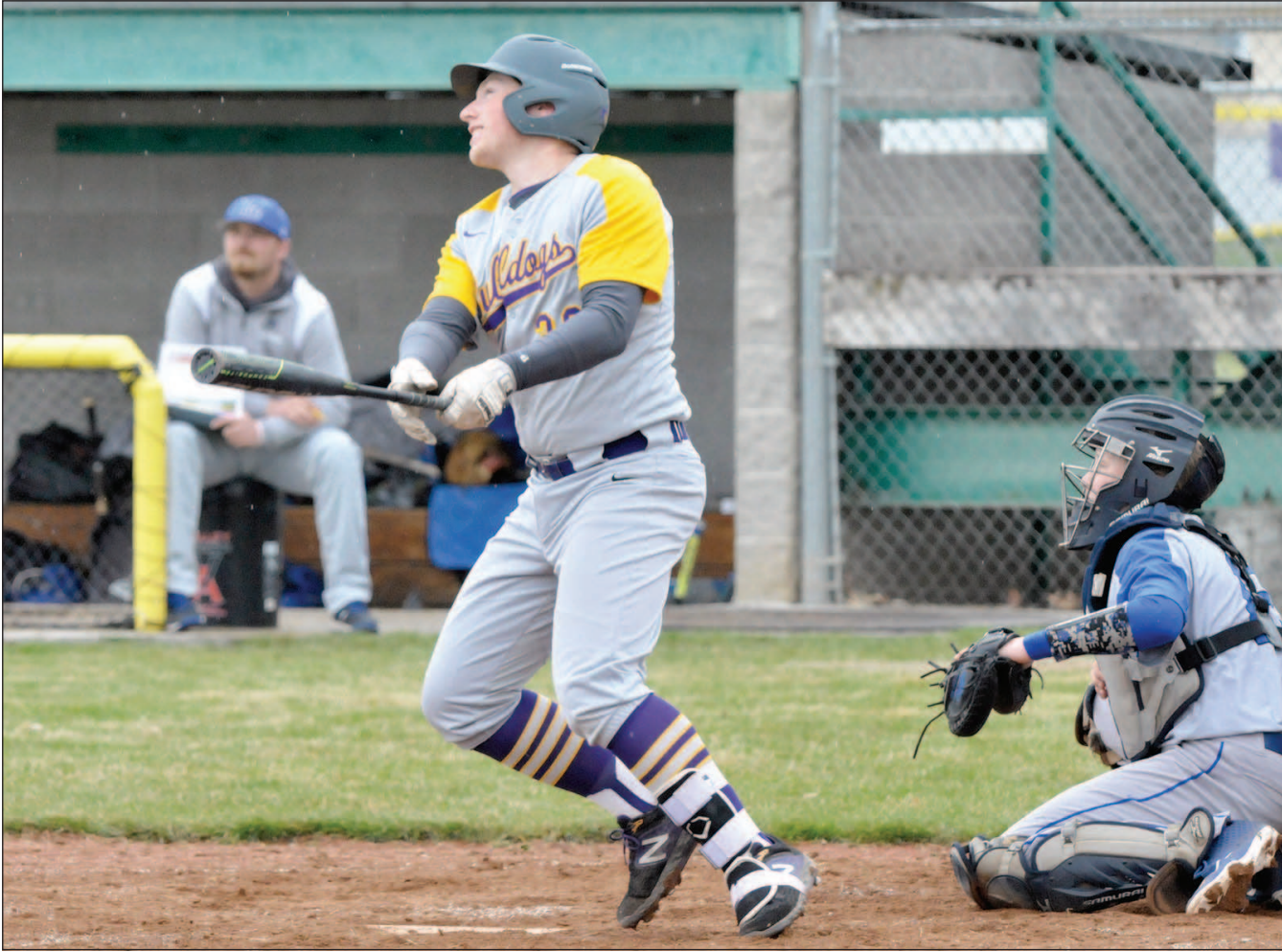
The Wildcats, coached by Baker High School gradu-

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Baker had a solid tuneup for the Greater Oregon League baseball stretch run Wednesday.

The Bulldogs hammered a dozen hits, including a pair of home runs, while routing Nyssa 16-4 in a nonleague game at the Baker Sports Complex.
