### 25 YEARS AGO from the Baker City Herald May 17, 1994

The Wallowa-Whitman National Forest will not lay off any permanent employees this year. Twenty-seven workers chose by the May 13 deadline to accept an incentive payment of up to \$25,000 to retire early or resign.

### 10 YEARS AGO from the Baker City Herald May 18, 2009

Baker City apparently will emerge unscathed from the purge that is closing nearly 2,000 new car dealerships nationwide.

Randy Daugherty, owner of Baker Garage, said this morning that he was not among the 1,100 General Motors dealers who received letters Friday notifying them that their contracts will not be extended when they expire in late 2010.

Also last week, the owner of Powder River Motors learned that Chrysler LLC, which has declared bankruptcy, did not add the dealership to the list of 789 company officials plan to close by June 9.

### ONE YEAR AGO from the Baker City Herald May 18, 2018

A quarter-sized sensor installed on the Union Pacific Railroad tracks near Weatherby, about 30 miles southeast of Baker City, is the newest technology designed to reduce the risk of a railroad accident.

"This is an ongoing effort to reduce the number of rail incidents," said Aaron Hunt, director of public affairs for Union Pacific.

The device is called SensorX. UP crews are installing 200 of the sensors in the Pacific Northwest as part of a test group. The goal, Hunt said, is to eventually install these sensors every two miles along the track.

The tiny device was developed by UP engineers as a more manageable version of Machine Vision, a scaffolding structure containing lasers, high-speed cameras, heat sensors and thermometers that collect data as trains pass by.

## SHEEP CREEK NEAR GRANDE RONDE RIVER

# Creek restoration to close roads

Sections of roads and trails along 4.5 miles of Sheep Creek, a tributary of the Grande Ronde River northwest of Anthony Lakes, will be closed starting Monday, May 20 to allow workers to place logs, rocks and other materials in the creek to improve fish habitat.

The closures will continue through July 2, according to the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest.

The closures, which are

southwest of Vey Meadows and west of Forest Road 51, include sections of Roads 5160, 5164 and 5182, as well as trails in the area.

Forest officials recommend visitors use Road 5155 as an alternate route to reach Road 5160.

"This project is creating better habitat for native fish and plants, as well as forage for wildlife, and it is directly benefiting our community by employing local

and regional contractors," La Grande District Ranger Bill Gamble said in the press release.

"Through our partnerships with Trout Unlimited, Grande Ronde Model Watershed, and the Bureau of Land Management, we are restoring hydrologic processes in Sheep Creek to more natural conditions," Gamble said.

Work crews will use helicopters and heavy

equipment to move logs, rocks and other material from along roads, then place them in Sheep Creek and its floodplain.

The project is designed to improve habitat for Snake River Basin summer steelhead, spring chinook salmon and other fish and wildlife species.

Lloyd L. Evans, 89, of Baker City, died May 14, 2019, at his home.

Lloyd was born on Oct. 21, 1929, at Baker City to Lloyd A. and Clara M. Wainsburg Evans.

He attended grade schools in Baker, Condon, Canyon City and John Day. He attended Baker High School for one year and then graduated from St. Francis Academy in 1947. He was awarded a basketball scholarship to the University of Portland which was the alma mater of his beloved coach, Father Stone.

Lloyd married Ida Sue Taylor in 1947 and they had a daughter, Diana. A 1950 marriage to Ramona (Dolly) Hendriksen produced two daughters, Linda and Eileen.

He enlisted in the U. S. Air Force in 1951 and served for four years, including during the Korean War. He was stationed at Mather Air Force Base in Sacramento and always felt fortunate to have attended training at the University of Connecticut.

In February 1956 he went to work for Ellingson Lumber Company at Izee in Grant County, and 3 1/2 years later moved to Unity where he managed the mill for Ellingson for 17 years. In 1968 he married Myrna Reinhart and they moved to Baker City and built a home in 1975. He continued to work for Ellingson Lumber Company and retired in 1992 after nearly 37 years.

Over the years he was active in many local and state endeavors. He was past master of the Unity Grange, chairman of the Unity Community Hall Boards of Directors, served for eight years on the Travel Advisory Committee of the Oregon Transportation Commission, was

a member and chairman of the Baker County Parks and Recreation Committee for 15 years, was involved with the Baker County Community Chest, was a member and chairman of the Baker City Golf Board for more than four years, was a lifetime member of the Baker City Golf Course and the Baker Elks Lodge No. 338, and a member of Amvets Post No. 1874 of Baker City.

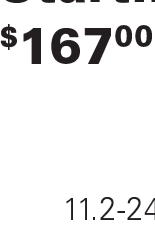
