# **Ducks roll past** Montana, 35-3

EUGENE — Justin Herbert isn't satisfied vet but he's confident that the Ducks are on the right path.

The senior quarterback threw for 316 yards and five touchdowns in No. 15 Oregon's 35-3 victory Saturday night over Montana, the Ducks' final tuneup before opening Pac-12 play at Stanford next week.

Jacob Breeland and Johnny Johnson III each caught a pair of touchdowns for the Ducks (2-1), who won their 25th straight nonconference game at Autzen Stadium.

"I think we've been doing some good things and definitely some stuff we can learn and fix, but I like the direction we're going in and I like the guys who've stepped up and made plays," Herbert said.

Herbert has thrown for a touchdown in 31 straight games, the longest current streak in the nation. It was his fifth career fivetouchdown game, most by an Oregon quarterback. Marcus Mariota had four.

Fifth-year senior Dalton Sneed threw for 184 yards for FCS-level Montana (2-1), which avoided its first shutout since 1988 with Brandon Purdy's 25-yard field goal late in the third quarter.

"We need to get better. We lost," Montana coach Bobby Hauck said when asked what his team can take away from the game. "We came here to win, and we didn't do it."

Oregon was coming off a 77-6 rout of Nevada that helped get the team back on track after a disappointing loss to Auburn in the season opener. Herbert also threw five TDs against the Wolf Pack and now has 11 for the season.

"We're a real brotherhood this year, and you know it's a real family on this team and I think he (Herbert) knows that and he's a big part of this family and we all look up to him," Johnson said.

Montana opened the season with wins over South Dakota and North Alabama, climbing into the STATS FCS Top 25 at No. 20. The Ducks are the second-highest ranked team the Grizzlies have faced in the modern era after a 63-7 loss to No. 7 Washington two years ago.

Montana senior receiver Jerry Louie-McGee caught six passes for 66 yards. He went into the game needing iust three catches to break Raul Pacheco's career record of 192 set in 1998.

Herbert made his first 10 passes of the game for 113 yards and two scores, both to Breeland.

### **Luton leads OSU past Cal Poly, 45-7**

CORVALLIS—The smallest player on the field had perhaps the biggest impact.

Oregon State wide receiver Champ Flemings, a 5-foot-5, 141-pound redshirt sophomore, had five catches for 142 yards and two long touchdowns from quarterback Jake Luton, leading Oregon State to a 45-7 victory over Cal Poly on Saturday.

The win snapped a sixgame losing streak for the Beavers (1-2)

"He's been waiting on a couple opportunities," second-year OSU coach Jonathan Smith said. "We've been giving him (opportunities) in the return game, but he got a bunch of time today at wideout and he made due on that."

Flemings had four receptions for 68 yards last season, receiving the bulk of his playing time on kick returns.

Both of Flemings' touchdowns Saturday came late in the second quarter as the Beavers increased a 24-7 lead to 38-7 at the

Flemings outjumped a defender at the goal line for a 47-yard score, which was the first touchdown of his college career.

"Jake just trusted me and he put the ball up," Flemings said. "The defender did go up and tried to pick it off, but I just felt like I could outjump him. So, I jumped up there, was able to track the ball with my eyes and make a good catch."

Flemings' second score came on a 75-yard catch and run with 21 seconds left in the first half. He also had a 66-yard kickoff return.

Luton passed for 255 yards and four first-half touchdowns — tying the school record for most touchdown passes in a half — and the Beavers' offense amassed 549 total yards despite the absence of leading rusher Jermar Jefferson, who was out with a foot injury.

Luton was coming off a subpar performance in last Saturday's 31-28 loss at Hawaii, but he was on target from the outset against the Mustangs. The sixth-year senior completed 17 of 22 passes.

He played one series in the third quarter before giving way to backup quarterback Tristan Gebbia.

"We're trying to build some depth and we're heading that way," Smith said.

The Mustangs (1-2), who lost 41-24 last week at Weber State, played a Pac-12 school for the second time in school history.

Cal Poly coach Tim Walsh said his biggest concern entering the game was the size of OSU's offensive line against the Mustangs' defensive front.

"Too many mistakes on the defensive side of ball, especially in the run game that gave us no opportunity to compete defensively in the first half," Walsh said.

Cal Poly had some success moving the ball between the 20-yard lines, but it struggled in the red zone.

Homedale finally scored on a 6-yard run from Freelove

with 1:56 left in the first quarter.

Uranga's 10-yard touchdown run with four minutes left in the first half gave Homedale a 14-0 edge.

The Trojans increased their lead to 21-0 two plays later when Freelove scooped up a Baker fumble and raced 30 vards for the touchdown.

Uranga then added his second TD run late in the half to boost Homedale's lead to 28-0 at halftime.

"They got their running game going in the second quarter," Ramos said of Homedale's 21-point period.
