Baker boys 3rd at Warrenton

WARRENTON — Baker's boys placed third in easy course Saturday at the annual Three Course Challenge cross-country races at Camp Rilea near Warrenton.

The Baker girls placed seventh. Kale Cassidy finished second in the individual standings, trailing Bend's Daniel Jackson 14:39 to 14:40.

Baker's top girls finisher was Lacey Jones, 34th in a time of 21:26.

UCLA rallies from 32-point deficit to shock Washington State, 67-63

PULLMAN (AP) — Coach Chip Kelly says he never lost faith in his UCLA team, even as it was losing its first three games.

Kelly said the Bruins played hard all 12 quarters of those losses, and that paid dividends when they fell behind at No. 19 Washington State on Saturday night.

Dorian Thompson-Robinson threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Demetric Felton with 1:07 left in the game as UCLA overcame a 32-point second-half deficit to claim a wild 67-63 victory over the Cougars.

“I always thought we were

a good football team,” Kelly said. “If we could be consistent.”

“When you are battle-tested like our guys are, I think that showed up today.”

The Bruins overcame a record nine TD passes by Washington State's Anthony Gordon.

After Felton's TD, Gordon was sacked and fumbled — the team's sixth turnover of the game — on the next possession with about a minute remaining and UCLA recovered and ran out the clock.

Thompson-Robinson threw for 507 yards and five touchdowns for UCLA (1-3,

1-0 Pac-12).

Gordon threw for 570 yards and broke the school record with nine TD passes for Washington State (3-1, 0-1).

Jacksonville Jaguars' starting QB Gardner Minshew, a sixth round draft pick who was on the WSU sidelines for Saturday's game, held the school record of seven TD passes in a game, set in November 2018 against Arizona.

Easop Winston Jr. was Gordon's favorite target. He caught four touchdown passes for Washington State.

Washington State jumped to a 35-17 lead at halftime, and pushed that to 49-17 early in the third quarter.

But UCLA, which had failed to score more than 14 points in each of its three losses, stormed back, erupting for three touchdowns in the final 4 minutes of the third. That was part of a run of seven touchdowns in eight possessions, many fueled by WSU turnovers.

Thompson-Robinson ran for one touchdown and threw scoring passes to Chase Cota and Felton to bring the Bruins within 49-38.

Portland State routs Mounties

PORTLAND (AP) — Davis Alexander threw for a career-high five touchdowns as Portland State closed out its nonconference schedule by thumping NAIAs Eastern Oregon 59-9 on Saturday afternoon.

Alexander was 25-of-34 passing for 366 yards for the Vikings (2-2) who open Big Sky Conference play against Idaho State next week.

Emmanuel Daigbe hauled in three passes for 109 yards, the longest being a 57-yard scoring strike that gave Portland State a 14-0 lead in the first quarter. Alexander also had TD tosses to Davis Koetter and

another one to Daigbe in the second quarter as the Vikings took a 31-0 lead into the break.

The Vikings continued to throw scoring tosses after Alexander sat down, finishing with seven touchdown passes. Nathan West threw to Malik Thirdgill for a touchdown and Jalen Chatman hit Marshaun Tucker for the 16 for the final score.

Portland State finished with 397 yards passing and 260 on the ground while limiting the Mountaineers to 80 and 53 respectively.

Kai Quinn threw for one touchdown for Eastern Oregon.

Huskies blitz BYU

PROVO, Utah (AP) — Winning games with elite defense is second nature to Washington. The Huskies are quickly silencing doubters who expected them to take a step back this season.

Relentless defensive pressure and efficient offense blended together perfectly for No. 22 Washington in a 45-19 victory over BYU on Saturday. The Huskies forced three BYU turnovers and scored a pair of touchdowns off those defensive plays.

In four games, Washington has allowed just 18.3 points per contest and held each opponent under 400 yards of total offense. The Huskies' defense resembles past units that led the Pac-12 in scoring defense and total defense each of the previous four seasons.

“We got people that are going to show up and work and we're going to execute when we're out there,” linebacker Brandon Wellington said. “Sometimes, it's not going to be pretty but we're going to figure out a way to get it done.”
