## Early miscues prove costly as Baker falls to La Grande, 34-21

■ Tigers turn a Baker fumble and interception into two first-half touchdowns after Baker leads early

La Grande's opportunistic defense took advantage of four first-half Baker turnovers Friday on the way to a 34-21 Greater Oregon League football win at Bulldog Memorial Stadium.

"Our defense was solid," said La Grande coach Rich McIlmoil.

But it was actually Baker's defense that first lit the scoreboard.

Two plays into the game Baker's Alex Hammans stole the ball from a La Grande runner and scooted 35 yards for the touchdown.

Hon Rushton's extra point gave the Bulldogs a quick 7-0 lead.

But it didn't last long. Less than two minutes later La Grande evened the score when Payton Cooper raced off right tackle and outran Baker defenders for a 51-yard TD.

That's when La Grande's defense took over.

The Tigers recovered a Baker fumble at the Baker 7. Two plays later quarterback Parker Robinson scored the first of his three touchdowns, going 5 yards off left tackle.

La Grande's Dawson Gaertner then intercepted Kaden Myer's pass, giving the Tigers the ball at the Baker 5.

La Grande added a TD run in the fourth quarter before Smith connected with Riley Flanagan for Baker's final score.

"We challenged the kids to play better in the second half," Ramos said. "We fixed some things. I was proud of the kids the way they played hard to the finish.'

Baker outscored La Grande 14-13 in the second half.

La Grande received a minor scare when Robinson was knocked out of the game twice in the second half.

### Timbers beat San Jose to clinch playoff berth

PORTLAND — Dairon Asprilla celebrated with a flip after his goal pulled Portland in front and the Timbers went on beat the San Jose Earthquakes 3-1 on Sunday for a spot in the playoffs.

Both teams went into the final match of the regular season vying for a postseason berth. The Timbers (14-13-7) finished sixth in the Western Conference and will face Real Salt Lake in the opening round.

The Earthquakes (13-16-5) were eliminated with the loss, but Chris Wondolowski's first-half goal extended his MLS career scoring record. San Jose ended the season with a sixgame losing streak.

The match was among the most closely watched on Decision Day, the final day of the regular season when all the matches are played simultaneously. In addition to the Earthquakes and Timbers, FC Dallas and the Colorado Rapids, were also vying for the final two playoff berths in the Western Conference. Dallas took the other spot with a 6-0 victory over Sporting Kansas City.

The Timbers, who also got goals from Larrys Mabiala and Sebastian Blanco, were winless in their previous five matches, setting up Sunday's deciding game.

Brian Fernandez, who has 11 goals for the Timbers this season, was suspended for the match because she was shown a red card in last weekend's 2-2 draw with Sporting Kansas City.

Portland also was without Diego Valeri because of a calf injury, as rumors continued to swirl about whether the Timbers' captain would be back with the team next season. Valeri is seeking a contract extension with the team.
