Friday the Badgers traveled to Cove, defeating the Leopards 25-20, 25-15, 25-16.

"Even through we came away with the win, we did suffer a major blow to our team, as Belle Blair was taken out of the game with a major ankle injury when she came down on an opponent's foot early in the third set," said Coach Marji Lind.

As Saturday dawned, the Badgers were faced with adversity and a new challenge of developing a new line-up for the two matches that awaited them that afternoon. This required that players accept new roles on the team. The first game of the day was against Nixyaawii. Powder Valley defeated the Golden Eagles 25-6, 25-9, 25-12.

Powder Valley then faced the No. 2-ranked Union Bobcats from the 2A division.

Powder dropped the first set 25-27. The Badgers then took the next two sets in a row 25-18, 25-18.

In the fourth set, Powder got off to a rocky start and ended up losing 18-25.

The fifth and final set, the Badgers won 15-8.

"It was amazing volley-ball played by both teams," Lind said. "The energy in the gym was electrifying and the look of love, accomplishment and unity among those 10 fantastic young women was utter satisfaction. It is amazing what a team can accomplish together"

WSU tops Colorado

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — After a few frustrating weeks, Washington State coach Mike Leach was pleased to see the Cougars play with a level of consistency that has been absent.

"Consistency and the mental tough ness to stay focused from one play to the next," Leach said. "Everyone wants to get ahead of themselves but all you have is that one play in the present moment and you better focus on that one and I thought we did a better job of keeping track of that tonight."

Anthony Gordon passed for 369 yards and four touch-

downs and Washington State rolled over Colorado 41-10 on Saturday, snapping the Cougars' three-game losing streak.

Gordon threw a 4-yard TD pass to Max Borghi and a 22-yarder to Dezmon Patmon in the first quarter as the Cougars (4-3, 1-3 Pac-12) jumped to a 14-0 lead, scored touchdowns on their first three drives and cruised to a needed victory. Gordon was 35-of-51 passing and connected with eight different receivers.

The WSU defense was excellent after weeks of getting shredded.

Altuve's homer lifts Astros

Houston
meets
Washington in
Game 1 of
World Series
Tuesday

HOUSTON — Jose Altuve, the 5-foot-6 driving force of Houston, delivered a swing that will play in Astros' highlights forever.

Altuve homered off Aroldis Chapman with two outs in the ninth inning and Houston outlasted the New York Yankees 6-4 Saturday night to advance to the World Series for the second time in three years.

"That's one of the best moments of postseason history," Houston general manager Jeff Luhnow said.

In a bullpen Game 6 with a back-and-forth finish, DJ LeMahieu hit a tying, two-run shot off Astros closer Roberto Osuna in the top of the ninth. Altuve answered with a two-run drive to left-center, setting off a wild celebration at Minute Maid Park and earning himself AL Champion-ship Series MVP.

"Beautiful game," Altuve said.

Astros ace Gerrit
Cole was waiting to
pitch a potential Game
7 on Sunday. Instead,
the postseason star
— undefeated since
May 22 — can be
lined up for Game 1 at
home against the NL
champion Washington
Nationals on Tuesday
night.

Yuli Gurriel hit a three-run homer in the first inning, and flashy outfield defense helped Houston's relievers defeat the Yankees and their vaunted bullpen.

It almost fell apart in the ninth. Gio
Urshela singled off
Osuna leading off for his third hit of the game, and LeMahieu put a ball into the first row of seats in right field — inches over the glove of leaping George Springer — to tie it at 4.
