In 2019, Crossroads celebrated our 56th year as Baker City's community art center. In addition to being a full service art gallery, Crossroads is also a teaching facility providing classes in art, movement and dance, and pottery offering a full service pottery studio. Crossroads resides in the old Carnegie Library Building behind Baker City Hall and is a community gathering space.

Crossroads hosts First Friday featuring new art work each month and a full service gift gallery representing diverse artists from around the region.

We invite you to come and take classes from Crossroads in a wide variety of arts, culture or movement disciplines. Crossroads teachers come from all walks of life, from professional artist to hobbyists with a love of teaching.
