Beavers upset Stanford

STANFORD, Calif. — Jarod Lucas heeded his coaches' words and looked for ways to take the pressure off Oregon State's top scorers Tres Tinkle and Ethan Thompson.

"I felt good, that was probably the main thing," Lucas said after scoring a season-high 21 points in the Beavers' 68-63 victory over Stanford on Thursday night. "Early on, Stanford was helping on Tres and Ethan, which is what a lot of teams do. Coach told the rest of us that we have to step up and make some shots, so they're not all over Tres and Ethan. Hopefully I did that."

Lucas scored 11 of his points in the final

4:05 of the first half, helping to give Oregon State (13-8, 3-6 Pac-12) a nine-point edge at halftime.

"We finally showed the toughness we were capable of," Beavers coach Wayne Tinkle said. "This time we got a real boost from the guys off the bench; it had been a little while."

Kylor Kelley matched his season-high with seven blocks and Oregon State ended a four-game losing streak to Stanford with the victory.

"He's the key to our success," Tinkle said. "When he's locked in on both ends, we are a different team. We played through some shaky spots. But that guy was huge on both ends at the rim."

Ducks outlast pesky Cal

BERKELEY, Calif. — Payton Pritchard did not wait long to turn his night around.

After a sluggish first half Thursday night, Oregon's senior guard took over in the second half and led the No. 11 Ducks to a 77-72 victory over California.

Pritchard finished with 21 points and became Oregon's all-time assists leader, showing the all-around offensive game that's made him one of the Pac-12's top players this

season.

Chris Duarte added 19 points as Oregon (18-4, 7-2 Pac-12) remained on top of the conference standings with the victory.

Matt Bradley scored 25 points to lead Cal (9-11, 3-4).

Pritchard was held to two points in the first half by a Cal team that looked capable of pulling off an upset much of the night.

With the score 32-32 at the half, Pritchard immediately made his presence felt when he returned from the intermis-

sion.

He nailed a 3-pointer and followed that up with a three-point play he converted on a reverse layup.

Cal took a 54-47 lead midway through the second half, but the Ducks went ahead for good on Anthony Mathis' 3-pointer that snapped a 58-58 tie with 6:53 remaining.

That basket was set up by Pritchard's 615th career assist, setting a new mark for the Ducks. Kenya Wilkins, who played for Oregon from 1993-97, held the previous record.
