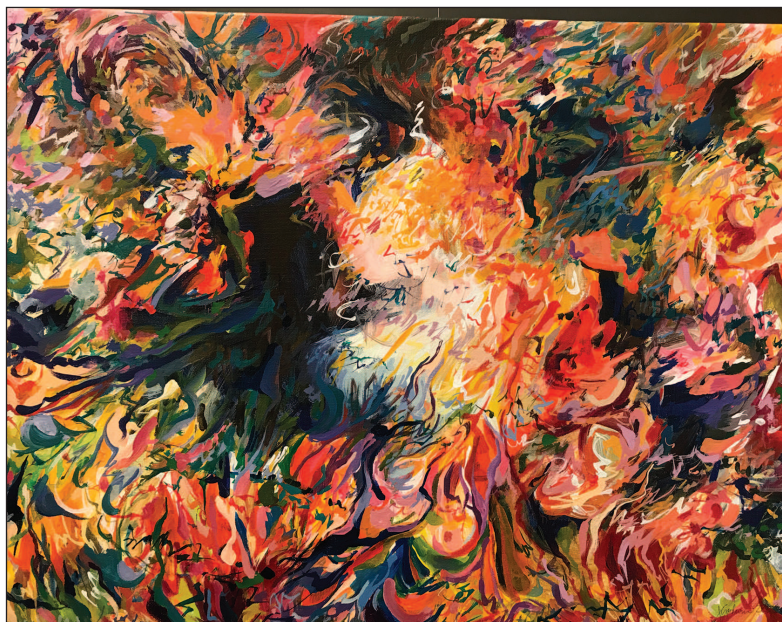

Moholt received a bachelor's in zoology from Oregon State University and a master's in avian behavior from Idaho State University.

He has spent the last three decades exploring all seven continents to capture the images of our world — both the familiar territory and the unknown wild.

With his background as a field biologist, Moholt has documented his adventures with the accessibility of photography and imagery. He captures the characteristics and emotive qualities of wildlife with landscape photography.

"From a rustic home in the wilds of Northeast Oregon to the most remote locations on earth, I am constantly amazed and challenged by the endless forms and variations that occur in the natural world,"

"A person could spend a lifetime exploring and interpreting such things. I intend to do so. In the end, the project is meant to portray the global impacts of human action when viewed from the scale of a single lifespan while contrasting this to the insignificance of humans when viewed on a geological timescale."
