■ Wallowa County singer-songwriter showcase presented in round-robin format

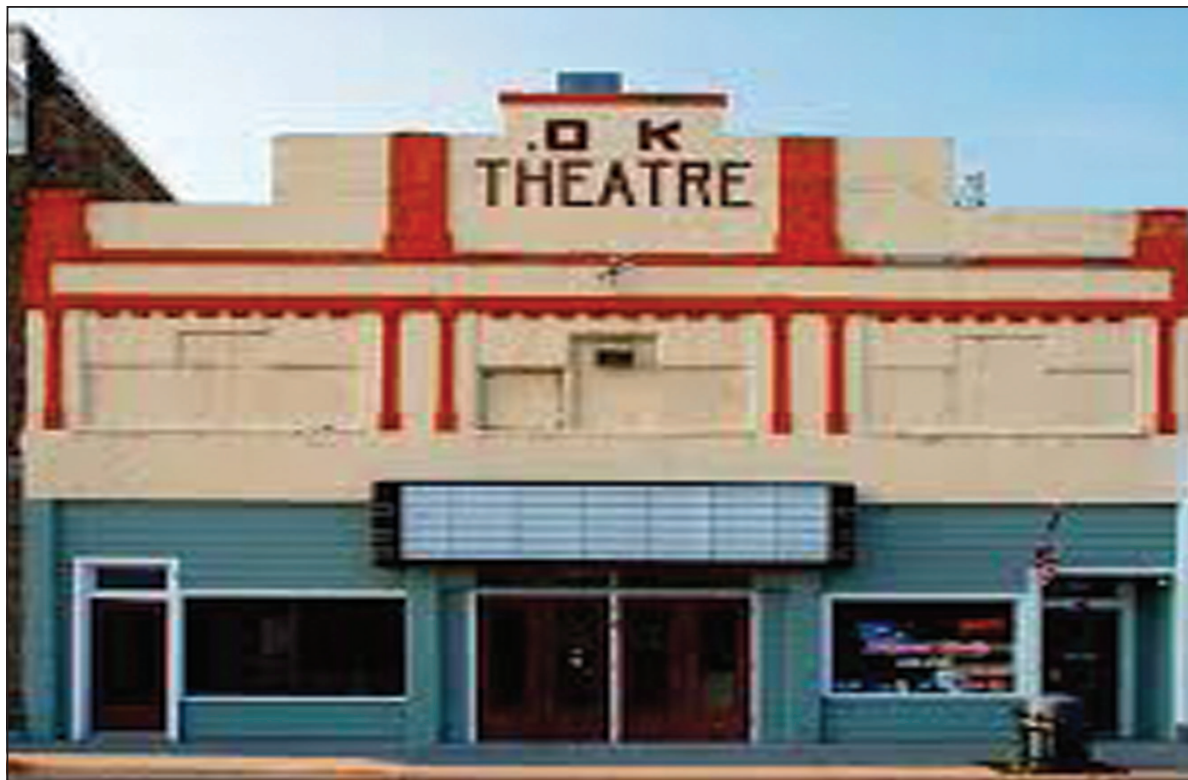

Now in its 15th season, Tunesmith Night has partnered with the historic OK Theatre in downtown Enterprise to continue the monthly showcases of original music pandemic-style.
