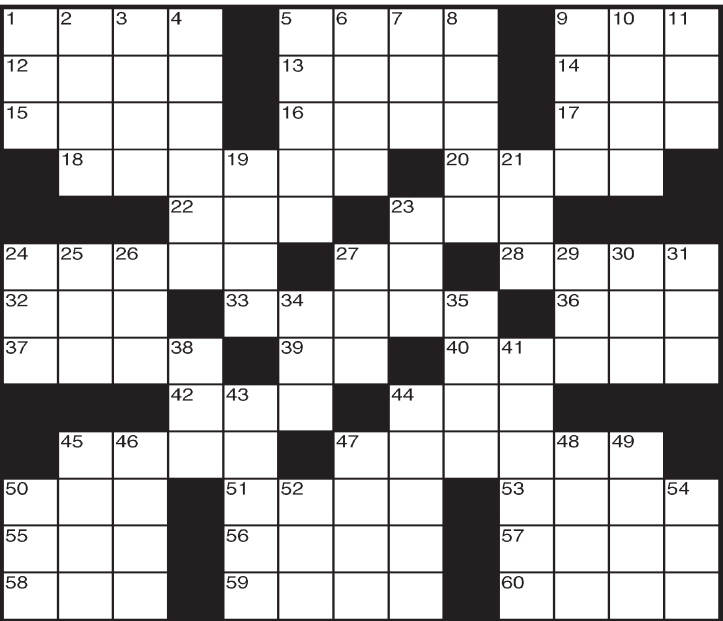

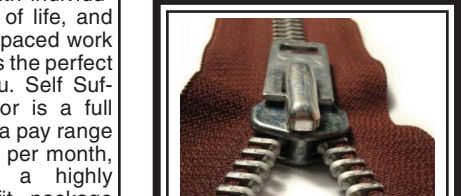

Five Points Fuels Reduction Proposed Action Scoping USDA Forest Service Wallowa-Whitman National Forest La Grande Ranger District

The La Grande Ranger District invites you to participate in the Five Points Fuels Reduction Project planning process. The Five Points project includes approximately 3,000 acres within the Five Points watershed; located in Union County, 5 air miles northwest of La Grande, OR. This project area is adjacent to the Mt. Emily Roadless area and Mt. Emily Recreation Area. A large percentage of the planning footprint is within the La Grande Valley Wildland Urban Interface.

This is a project utilizing the categorical exclusion for wildfire resilience authorized under section 605 of the Healthy Forests Restoration Act. We propose a combination of commercial harvest and non-commercial thinning, including follow-up treatments such as post-harvest understory removal, piling, and burning.
