STATE CLASS 4A CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP MEET

Baker girls 3rd, boys place 8th at state meet

■ Sydney Keller finishes fourth in individual standings, Justin Ash takes fifth

Baker's cross-country teams had a strong performance at the state Class 4A meet, the girls placing third and the boys eighth on Saturday, April 10 at Marist High School in Eugene.

Senior Sydney Keller led the Baker girls with a fourthplace finish in the individual standings.

Senior Justin Ash placed fifth for the Bulldogs.

"It went perfect. It was great running conditions, the course was brand new to us - it was fast and a good course," Baker coach Suzy Cole said. "The kids liked it, and the event went off great and we did exactly what we knew we had to do."

Cole said she was impressed with Ash's performance, finishing the 5-kilometer course in 16:06.5.

"He ran phenomenal," Cole said. "The last time he was in a state cross country meet he was our fifth runner, and it was kind of after that meet he decided he pretty much loved running, so he's been running pretty much nonstop since then. All of his hard work, his effort and his passion has paid off in every meet for him this year, and I was extremely impressed with how confident he looked. He did a great job."

In the girls race, Keller, who finished ninth in the 2019 state meet, ran a 19:28.2 to claim fourth overall.

With four other Bulldogs placing in the top 33 — Emma Baeth, Sydney Lamb, Salena Bott and Corah Downing — Baker finished third in the team standings with 89 points, just two points behind runner-up Sisters and eight points behind state champion Siuslaw.

"If you want to be competitive as a team, you have to pack up your group. Your fourth and fifth runners set

Cole saw multiple Baker boys and girls set personal records in the season's final meet, in some cases beating their previous best by nearly one minute.

"It's a huge accomplishment given this short season," Cole said. "It's been interesting trying to coach through it, and train through it, and we had a lot of kids that were close to (one-)minute PR's. They just ran confidently and gutty, and that's exactly what you want to happen at a state meet."

Although Saturday's meet was the final competition for Baker's seniors — Ash on the boys side, Keller, Bott, Downing and Avril Zickgraf on the girls — Cole said she was excited to see the four Baker boys who, as sophomores, got their first experience at the state level. Those are Thaddeus Pepera, Jordan Mills, Gabriel Bott and Seth Mastrude.

"For the sophomores, it really was getting them introduced to the state meet, getting them exposed to it and they competed so well," Cole said. "I was just very impressed with them."

Several cross-country runners will move immediately to the track and field season, which starts this week when the Bulldogs host an invitational meet Thursday, April 15 at 2:30 p.m.

Adebayo, Butler lead Heat past Blazers, 107-98

PORTLAND - Bam Adebayo scored 22 points and Jimmy Butler added 20 to lead the Miami Heat to a 107-98 victory over the Portland Trail Blazers on Sunday night.

The Heat, who have won six of their last seven games, led by as many as 20 points early in the fourth

CJ McCollum and Norman Powell each finished with 17 points for the Blazers, who were hurt by 17 turnovers. Miami's aggressive defense held Damian Lillard to just 12 points on an off night when he made just three shots from the field, all 3-pointers.

Adebayo said it was important to set a tone to start a four-game road trip.

"We were just trying to really hone in on defense. We just really felt with this team that's how you win," Adebayo said. "We were able to get stops and get into transition and get a few dunks. That's why we won by a lot."

The Heat were without Victor Oladipo indefinitely because of right knee soreness. Oladipo, acquired by the Heat on March 25 in a trade with Houston, was injured in the fourth quarter of Miami's victory over the Los Angeles Lakers on Thursday.

Kendrick Nunn started in Oladipo's place. Nunn, who didn't play in six straight games after injuring his ankle early in a March 26 game against Charlotte, finished with 15 points.

"We know on the road we have to be able to defend at a high level," Heat coach Erik Spoelstra said. "Our defense has to travel. It's a key to our success."

Kanter sets Blazers' rebound record in win over **Detroit Pistons**

PORTLAND (AP) -With each rebound that Enes Kanter added to his new Portland record, his teammates on the bench wildly cheered.

Kanter had 24 points and a franchise-record 30 rebounds, and the Blazers beat the Detroit Pistons 118-103 on Saturday night.

Kanter bested Sidney Wicks' Portland record of 27 rebounds set in 1975. Kanter also surpassed his own career high of 26 set while with the Knicks in 2018.

The raucous sideline cheers were a fitting tribute to Kanter, who has served as both a backup and a starter this season as needed.

"I was so happy when I looked at the bench and everybody was up, everybody was cheering, everybody was smiling, everybody was supporting their teammates. That's what we're all about," Kanter said. "That's what Blazers basketball is all about, just supporting each other."
