### FISHING REPORT

### **IT'S FREE FISHING** WEEKEND IN OREGON

Everyone can fish, clam and crab for free in Oregon on Saturday and Sunday, June 5-6.

No fishing licenses or tags (including a Combined Angling Tag, Columbia River Basin Endorsement or Two-Rod Validation) are required by Oregon residents or nonresidents to fish, crab or clam in Oregon on those dates.

Although no licenses or tags are required these two days, all other fishing regulations apply including closures, bag limits and size restrictions.

With Oregon facing a serious drought this summer, warmwater fishing is a good choice for Free Fishing Weekend and throughout the summer.

Oregon will have one more Free Fishing Weekend in 2021-the two days after Thanksgiving, Friday and Saturday, Nov. 26-27.

### **TROUT STOCKING**

Scheduled to be stocked the week starting May 31: Morgan Lake, Powder River, Phillips Reservoir, Long Creek Pond, Anson Wright Pond, Marr Pond, Trout Farm Pond, Twin Ponds, Wildcat Pond, Holliday Pond, Hog Creek Pond.

### **MALHEUR RESERVOIR**

Fishing is great for rainbow trout from 10 to 20+ inches. This reservoir was recently stocked with tagged trophy trout, some are marked with reward tags. If you catch a tagged trout please report it here: MyODFW.com/tagteam.

### **IMNAHA RIVER**

The flows are moderate and conducive to fishing. The Imnaha will begin to see large hatches of salmonflies and golden stoneflies, which can make for some good trout fishing. Anglers should be aware that some construction/utility work is occurring on the lower Imnaha, and trucks will be on the road hauling equipment and materials. Anglers should use caution when traveling in the area. Spring chinook and bull trout will be present in the system and must be released unharmed.

### **GRANDE RONDE RIVER**

The flows on the Grande Ronde have been good for boating but the fishing has been slow. Look for fish in areas where flows are very slow like back eddies and river margins below structure. Bass fishing should pick up in the next few weeks as flows drop and the water temperatures begin to rise.

#### PHILLIPS RESERVOIR

Due to extreme drought, Phillips Reservoir is just 17% full. Rainbow were stocked during May, which means fishing should be quite good (more fish, smaller area) well into June. Please note that those looking to launch a boat should avoid the Union Creek Campground boat launch as the water level is far below the launch; please use the boat ramp near Mason Dam.

### WALLOWA COUNTY PONDS

The early trout stocking for Marr Pond has been canceled through late June to accommodate improvements to accessibility. With the exception of Marr Pond, all stocked waterbodies have received at least the they're first stocking and fishing should be good.

Forest ponds are mostly accessible and some have been recently stocked.

### WALLOWA LAKE

Wallowa Lake is open, and

anglers are starting to catch a few early kokanee. Wallowa Lake has been stocked and fishing for trout is good.

Spring is a good time to fish for lake trout as they're active and can sometimes be found in the shallow areas. Methods typically involve good electronics, downriggers and sometimes jigging.

### **MAGONE LAKE**

Fishing has been excellent the last few weeks, and should stay that way over the next month.

### WALLOWA RIVER

The Wallowa River can fish well for trout throughout the spring as long as conditions allow. With lower expected flows this year the river should fish well throughout the spring. The Wallowa has very good caddis and golden stone hatches that last through June and can spur some very good fishing. Look for fish to pull up close to the banks to escape faster flowing water.


