conductor of the Inland Northwest Musicians, and apprentice conductors Ashley Walchli and Donald Dugan. Selections to be performed include "Jurassic Park Theme" by John Williams, a selection of songs from Simon and Garfunkel, "Pennywhistle Jig" by Henry Mancini, "Isle of Capri" by Will Grosz, "March Noble" by Christian Bach, "Danza" by Vaclav Nelhybel and the "Sounds of Norway" by Edvard Grieg.

According to a press release, the Willow Creek Symphony is a preparatory orchestra, providing an orchestral experience for developing instrumentalists of all ages. Adults and students play and learn together, sometimes several generations within families.
