"In it, actress Grace Tanner makes another stage appearance, this time as Lady Augusta Bracknell," Turner said. The other cast members are Sam Shown as Jack, Liberty O'Dell as Algernon, Abbie Shown as Gwendolen, Cassandra Johnson as Cecily, Beth Wiseman as Miss Prism, Michael Cooper as Reverend Chasuble and Victoria Ingram as the butler.

"The Importance of Being Earnest" is directed by Cody Wyld Flower.

"The reason I chose this play is because it's charming and romantic, and it's quite laugh-outloud funny, even 130 years later," Turner said.

Set in London, the plot focuses on some socially well-to-do people, including two young men, Algernon and Jack, who want to marry Gwendolen and Cecily.

"However," Turner said, "these two women have made it very plain to these young men that they each want to marry someone named Earnest."

How Algernon and Jack try to jump through this hoop is at the heart of this farcical comedy. Being sincere and being Earnest are not going to be easy tasks for these young men when they realize they must pass the scrutiny of Lady Bracknell. She is the embodiment of Victorian respectability and an impediment to romance and happiness — never lacking for opinions and always looking out for her own interests as well as the young ladies.
