PENDLETON — What does it mean to remember? How much can we trust our memory? Is every encounter new or can something we forgot find us again?

Walla Walla artist Ali Pope contemplates these questions in her new exhibit in the Lorenzen Gallery at Pendleton Center for the Arts, 214 N. Main St.

"Ali Pope: A Fluid Mind" will be on display through March 31, and admission is free, thanks to support from Coldwell Banker Farley Company.

"Memories are fluid; they flow in and out of our minds like vapor slipping between the cracks of our subconscious. They reach out to connect us with our past like shadowy fingers extending into space," Pope writes in her artist's statement. "Memories shine a light from the past as we remember smells, warmth and voices. Our memories may also startle us out of our present, pulling us through time and into darkness we thought we'd left behind. These forms embody the challenge of finding what has been lost to the recesses of our minds or the struggle to forget."

Pope uses painting, printmaking


and sculpture to examine memory and question the reliability of human consciousness. Her most recent work, "Edge of Memory," represents what is found and lost in the gaps of our recollection.
