EXTRA-TANGY TARTAR SAUCE

Yield: 8 servings

- 3/4 cup mayonnaise 1 medium shallot, finely minced (about 2 tablespoons)
- 3 tablespoons capers, drained, patted dry and finely minced 6 to 8 cornichons, finely
- minced, see note 1 teaspoon granulated sugar 2 tablespoons finely
- minced fresh parsley 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- Note: Cornichons are small, vinegary French pickles. They can be found in the pickle or olive section of a supermarket. For a slightly sweeter sauce,

substitute 2 tablespoons sweet pickle relish for the cornichons.

Combine the mayonnaise, shallot, capers, cornichons, sugar, parsley and pepper in a small bowl. Season to taste with salt. Transfer to an airtight container and refrigerate for at least 1 hour before using. Tartar sauce will keep for up to 1 week in the refrigerator.

CREAMY NEW YORK DELI COLESLAW

Yield: 6 to 8 servings

1 head red or green cabbage (2 pounds), cored and shredded 1 teaspoon salt, plus more

- for seasoning ½ teaspoon caraway seeds
- or celery seeds ½ cup mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons white vinegar 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon granulated sugar 1/4 teaspoon black pepper,
- plus more for seasoning 2 carrots, peeled and grated 1 small onion, minced

1. Toss the cabbage with 1 teaspoon salt and allow to sit in a colander for at least 1 hour or up to 4 hours. Meanwhile, toast the caraway seeds in a small skillet over medium heat until fragrant, about 3 minutes.

2. Rinse the cabbage, then pat thoroughly dry with paper towels. Whisk the toasted caraway seeds,




