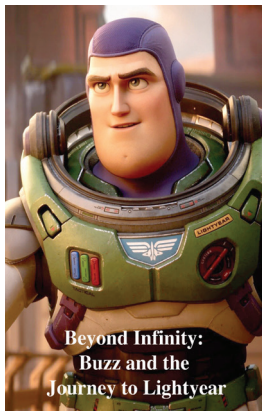
"Rise" (June 24)
