In that year there were 81 births -42 girls and 39 boys. During the same period 35 deaths were recorded. In 1918 there were 57 births and

41 deaths. In 1919 there were 61 births and

36 deaths. The year 1920 showed a far greater number of births than in either of the preceding years, and fewer deaths.

Compared with 1918 there were an even dozen more babies born and half a dozen fewer deaths, which is health standpoint, and also in the matter of increasing population.


