Seven of the ten communities which have adopted home improvement as a part of their year's extension work had representatives at the county project meeting which was held at Myrtle Point on Wednesday, August 10.

Mrs. C. E. Schroeder, county leader in Home Improvement, called the meeting to order at eleven o'clock.

A rather extensive county program was adopted, including all parts of the project, different phases of which will be adopted by each community according to their special interests.

A special effort will be made to improve home yards. This will be begun by a series of lectures on "The Home Beautiful." It was suggested that encouragement for improvement might be given if a system of scoring were made and used, prizes being given after a certain period of time...

The testing circles will be continued, kitchen surveys made occasionally in order to ascertain the number of conveniences added from time to time, demonstrations given in interior decorations and refashioning of furniture, houses planned and plans for remodeling made and every effort will be made to work out methods to make the housewife's work as easy as possible...
