

Death of Lawrence Russell

Lawrence G. Russell, captain of the Coos River launch Welcome, brother of Elmer E. Russell, of Coquille, died suddenly at 3 o'clock Monday morning at the home of his sister-in-law, Mrs. Harvey Russell, at 373 Commercial avenue. He had been ill only since Friday and hemorrhage was the cause of his death.

Dr. L. G. Johnson performed an autopsy and found no evidence of flu. Dr. Johnson said that Mr. Russell had some violent coughing spells from a severe cold and in one of these ruptured a blood vessel in his throat. This was reopened several times, causing hemorrhages. Sunday and Monday morning two blood transfusion operations were performed. Elmer Russell and Leonard Russell furnished the blood.

Mr. Russell came down Thursday morning on the Welcome and not feeling well, decided not to go back up the river that afternoon. He gradually grew worse and Sunday he suffered hemorrhages and it was realized that his condition was critical. Mr. Russell's father, John W. Russell, and his brother, Harvey Russell, and the latter's little baby all died within two weeks at Portland two years ago when the flu epidemic was on.

Booze Sleuths

It is supposed that the federal prohibition officers who have been on Coos Bay for the past two weeks are about ready to make returns on their investigations, or else, as before, have found nothing on which to start a clean-up. Their work has not been productive of much information to others than themselves this time, for they came with the experience of their predecessors who were identified and given one or two wild goose chases. The squad now on the ground is estimated to number from two to four men. They are staying at a "quiet" place, where traveling men are not likely to come along and recognize them.

How much they have accomplished is not known. There have been no reports from outlying districts of their having been out on the skiffish line, nor have any reports been made of their having been seen on duty.

It was understood the locality they are chiefly interested in is South Slough where local officers failed to find any moonshining and where some are afraid to go.—Marshfield Daily News.

Tall Fir Is Struck

During the thunder storm Thursday morning, which cannonaded this vicinity for several minutes, lightning struck a tall fir near the high school, stripping it of bark on one side, and causing the top of the tree to fall. Old residents claim this is the only instance of damage of any kind done in North Bend by lightning.—Coos Bay Harbor.
