Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 231, passed by the Common Council of the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, on the 2nd day of May, 1922, and entitled:

"An Ordinance levying and declaring an assessment against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land benefitted by the improvement of portions of Spurgeon and Fourth streets, in the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, directing the City Recorder to enter a statement thereof in the Docket of City Liens, and declaring an emergency."

An assessment was levied and declared against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land benefitted by the improvement of portions of Spurgeon and Fourth streets within the boundaries of the assessment district, which assessment district and the boundaries thereof are described as follows:
