Other counties roduced the following vaules: Coos \$748; Curry, \$863; Douglas, \$3108; Grant, \$109,822; Jackson, \$32,495; Josephine, \$126,388; Lane, \$1223; Malheur, \$3450; Wheeler, \$1088. Gold constituted far the greater

part for the year's output as to value, having a value of \$882,034.
