Submitted by the Legislature—AMENDMENT PERMITTING LINN COUNTY TAX LEVY TO PAY OUTSTANDING WARRANTS—Purpose: To amend section 10 of article XI of the constitution of the state of Oregon so as to require the annual levy of a tax of two mills on the dollar on all taxable property of Linn county, Oregon, until all warrants of said county outstanding December 31, 1921, are paid with legal interest and permitting such levy to be made in excess of the limitations fixed by said section 10 of Article XI. Biermann, Manager, 316 Stock Exchange Building, Portland, Oregon—SINGLE TAX AMENDMENT—Purpose: To amend section 1 of article IX of the constitution of the state of Oregon to read as follows: From July 1, 1923, to and including July 1, 1927, all revenue for maintenance of state, county, municipal and district government shall be raised by a tax on land irrespective of improvements thereon or thereon, and thereafter the full rental value of land, irrespective of improvements, shall be taken in lieu of all other taxes for the maintenance of government, and for such other purposes as the people may direct. Wiedner, Albany, Oregon, Legislative Committee—INCOME TAX AMENDMENT—Purpose: To require that one-half of the tax levy for state expenses each year be levied on net incomes of natural persons and corporations beginning with 1924, the annual rate of income tax to be fixed by dividing the amount of tax required by the total net amount of all incomes subject to such tax; providing personal exemptions of from \$500 to \$1,000 for unmarried persons and from \$1,000 to \$1,500 for married persons and \$500 additional for each dependent; also life insurance, gifts, bequests, devises and inheritances, and charitable corporations and corporations exempted by United States income tax law.
