More Juice For Power Co.

The new 115-mile, 110 volt transmission line which links together a chain of interconnected systems of prominent electric distributing companies on the Pacific Coast, of which Mountain States Power Company is one, extending from Portland, Oregon, to San Francisco, was put in service on November 1, 1922. This line was built under a contract between Mountain States Power Company and the California-Oregon Power Company which provides for the purchase of a larger block of hydro-electric power—15,000 horsepower—for distribution among Mountain States Power Company customers in the Willamette Valley, Oregon. The line connects the Mountain States Power Company's substation at Springfield, Oregon, with the hydro-electric plant of the California-Oregon Power on the Rogue River at Prospect, Oregon.

The steam plants of Mountain States Company in the Willamette Division have depended heretofore upon saw-mill refuse as fuel, and the supply has been irregular at times; the new source of energy supply will permit these plants to close down, and they will be maintained as reserve stations for operation only in time of emergency.

We will all rejoice to see the day when the steam plants of Coos county are linked up with this interstate system and our supply of juice will no longer depend upon sawmill refuse at Marshfield.
