

Road Work in Curry

In reporting the progress of work in Curry the Port Orford Tribune says:

"The rock crusher at the gravel camp at Brush Creek had to suspend operations last week for want of available road according to Joseph Lisner, resident engineer for the federal bureau of roads, who is in charge of the work.

"Grading on the Linnville hill-Arizona Inn unit has been slow because of the continued rains. Eleven teams are employed and the slides which occurred during the winter have been removed and it is thought that with dry weather the road will be open to traffic in about a month.

"Four big trucks, loaned to the state highway commission by the federal government, are used to haul the gravel from the crusher and distribute it on the highway, and two or possibly three more trucks will be brought in shortly to facilitate the work.

"It is expected that the grading of the Port Orford-Elk river unit of the Roosevelt highway will be completed and ready for the gravel this week. Contractor Haakensen has not started grading between the two bridges yet, owing to the non-arrival of a hoist, which has been ordered from Seattle, and which will be used to convey the gravel from the bar to the bunkers.

"Crews of men are working on both the Sixes and Elk bridges and on the Elk river bridge the steel is nearly all laid in position. The riveting machine has not arrived as yet. The highway will probably be completed by October 1st.

"Mr. Haakensen has sub-let the gravel contract to James B. Jones, of Portland, who is also a logging contractor, and who will probably take a contract in the woods and bring in sufficient trucks for both jobs.

Getting Started on Jetty

Two carloads of machinery, camp equipment and other supplies for the harbor work arrived in Marshfield Monday and were placed aboard a barge and towed to the site of the jetty operations at the entrance to the bay.

A pile driver was also towed down while the port dredge left Wednesday for the scene of the gigantic harbor improvement work.

Resident Engineer Cole, assistant to Lieutenant Bowley, is now on the ground and is taking charge of the machinery and other equipment as it arrives.

The government tug Wilson is now up north to bring down a cargo of other machinery to be used in the jetty work.

These various signs of activity indicate that the government engineers are losing no time in getting this immense improvement work under way.—News.

Sells One-half Interest

Hal Stutman, who has been engaged in mining on the beach north of Bandon, last week disposed of half his interests in a considerable property, to the Los Angeles syndicate which recently purchased the John R. Smith mine and holdings. Mr. Stutman, knowing the possibilities of his mine, would not sell outright and kept

a half interest for himself.

Mr. Stutman has been engaged by the Los Angeles company to stay with the company on salary.—News.

Contesting Land Entry

An interesting dispute over land has been filed with the land office at Roseburg, wherein Ed Yoakam, a logging operator, is contesting the entry of John Gilflan who, since O. & C. land was opened to entry, filed his papers for possession of 80 acres at Delmar, south of the former Taylor Siglin place and cut by the county highway.

The property, being on the highway, is considered of value and besides bench and hill land, contains a considerable area in the tideflats on the east side of the highway.

The time for a hearing has not been named, but it is thought the evidence will be taken in Marshfield before Commissioner Duncan Douglas and transferred to Roseburg for final hearing.

Mr. Yoakam is now logging in the vicinity of Conledo. Mr. Gilflan is a miner and formerly worked in the Hennessey mine.—News.
