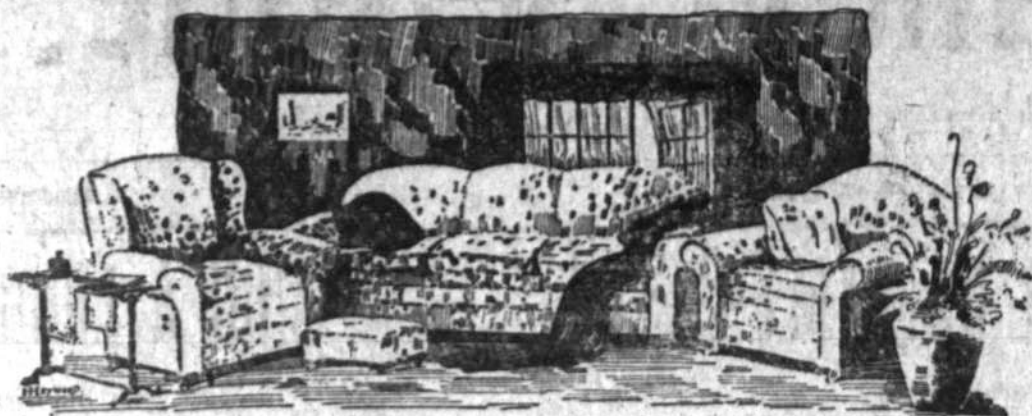

Decision of the Judges

Hawley Supports the Bill

The McNary-Haugen Export Corporation Bill, now before Congress, is receiving the hearty support of Representative W. C. Hawley of Oregon, who has issued the following series of questions and answers regarding the measure:

What is the purpose of the McNary-Haugen Export Corporation Bill?

To equalize the farmer's dollar with the other man's dollar.

How will it accomplish this purpose?

By the establishment of an export agency to handle wheat and other major farm products if and when necessary, under provisions which will maintain legitimate prices.

Does this mean the Government is going into the general farm marketing business?

No, it will operate through regular channels, and deal only as necessary to maintain proper prices.

Will it destroy co-operative marketing?

It will encourage co-operative marketing by assisting co-operative associations in a task which they cannot accomplish without such aid.

What effect will it have on the millers?

It will relieve millers from the danger of serious price fluctuations, due to speculation or other cause.

What will it do to present prices of farm products?

It will increase present prices for wheat from 40 to 60 cents a bushel, hog prices about 40 per cent, cattle about 30 per cent, etc.

Will it increase production?

Not more than profitable prices for farm products secured by any other means, and profitable prices must be obtained unless American Agriculture is to perish.

How does it affect the business man and banker?

America is an agricultural nation. The success of all depends on the success of agriculture. The McNary-Haugen bill means success for agriculture.

Is it fair to other industries?

Exactly. Under the bill farm prices increase only as prices for other products increase. It does for

Wonderful Cows

Three new state butter producing champion Holstein cows for Oregon are announced by the advanced registry department of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

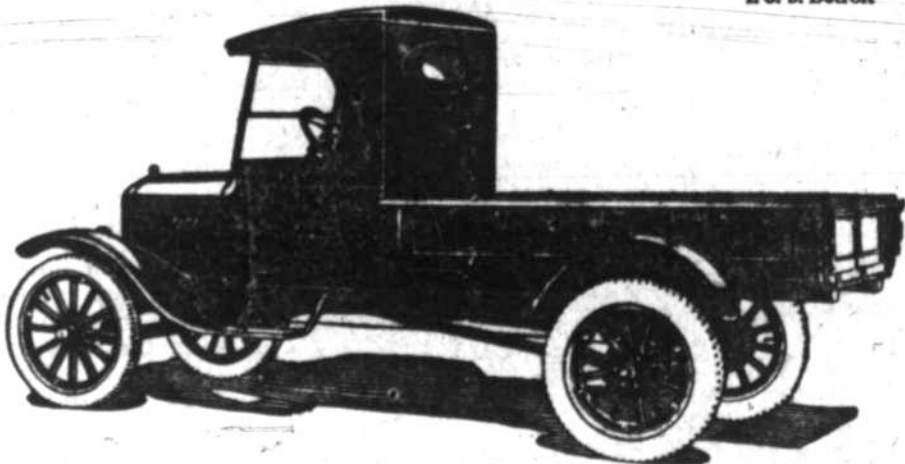
Lucy Freela Pontiac 3rd is the new state leader for production in one year as a senior two-year-old with a record of 19,625.6 pounds milk and 697.52 pounds butterfat—equal to 871.9 pounds butter. She is owned by Max Arp at Eugene.

With a record of 15,787 pounds milk containing 588.02 pounds butterfat, equivalent to 725 pounds butter, Bessie Princess Crown of the J. A. Lindow herd at Portland is now the state's highest record senior four-year-old for ten months' production. Another cow of this herd, Enid Gold Dust Crown 2nd, a senior two-year-old, produced in ten months 12,830.5 pounds milk and 407.61 pounds butterfat—equal to 509.5 pounds butter, which makes her also a state leader.
