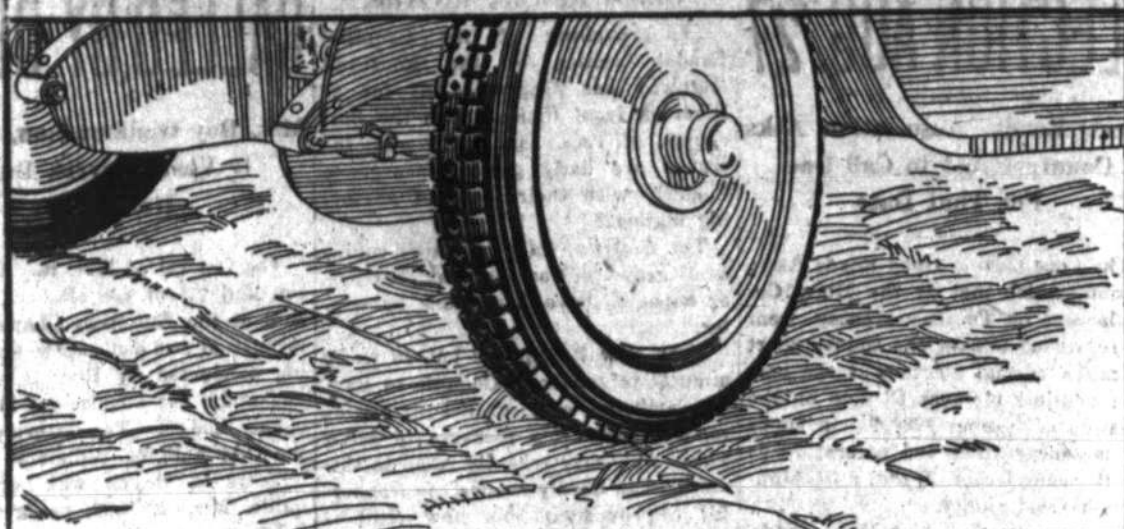

Gold Mining in Oregon

In southwestern Oregon water was scant and the placer mines made only a short run, during the first six months of 1924, but development was continued on several quartz properties, notably the California mine, at Mount Reuben, and the Millionaire and Sylvania mines, near Gold Hill. Milling has been done at two properties in the Galice district, at three in the Rogue River district, two in the Gold Hill district, and one each in the

Applegate, Chetco, Holland, and Lower Rogue districts. It is reported that a 25-ton sampler will be put in commission about the middle of July at Gold Hill, which should make possible the operation of many small deposits, whose size does not warrant the construction of individual mills.

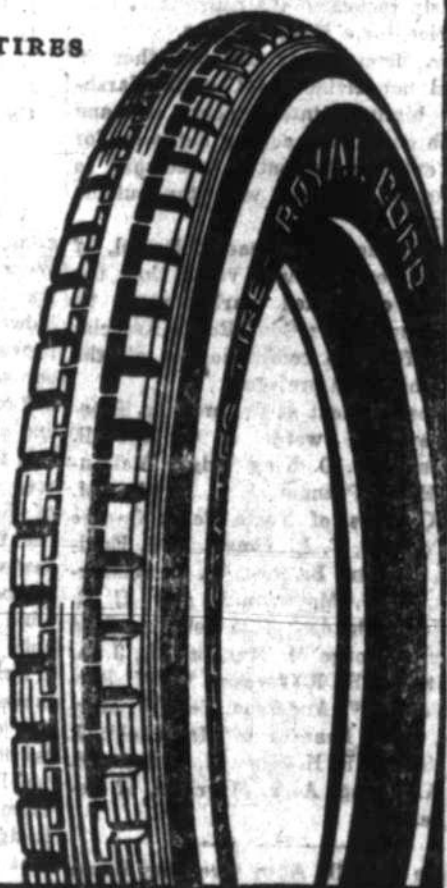
