Silver-Coins for Europe

The German government has placed orders with two American producing companies for 4,000,000 ounces of silver, valued at \$2,760,000. This is the second largest order ever received in America from a foreign government, a larger one having been placed by the Polish government a few weeks ago, when 6,400,000 ounces were purchased. Both governments will use the American silver for minting new coins. The deliveries to the two governments are to begin at once and to be completed in a few months. The German contract will be filled by the American Smelting & Refining Co. and the United States Smelting & Refining Co., while the order from Poland is to be filled by the Anaconda Copper Mining Co. and the American Metals Co. It is said that most of the countries of Europe are in need of metal coins for domestic circulation.

To Canada for Husbands

For every 100 women in Canada there are 106 men. So Canada solves the problem of importing women from England as was done 300 years ago by the American colonies. And the plan suits England, for statistics estimate England has a surplus of 2,000,000 women. Parties of women and girls are formed in England, brought to Canada under reliable escort and offered jobs in whatever line of work they may choose. As each ship lands, scores of housewives are on hand to hire servants, and farmers offer them jobs in the rural districts. So far as the marriage question is concerned, the women have proved able to take care of that detail. Records show that most of the girls are married within a year and settle down on farms of their own.

Met Our Old Friend

Dr. Hugo Gluck, who is professor of pharmaceutical botany at Heidelberg, Germany, arrived in this country a couple of weeks ago, and the first person he hunted up was our old co-laborer, E. S. Miller at Wading River, Long Island. We can easily imagine our old friend, who hasn't been doing much in the botanical line for forty years, renewed his youth in introducing this German professor to the rare plants at Long Pond, Mattituck, Quogue, Amagansett, Moriches, Speonk, Shelter Island and Ronkonoma.

New Wrinkles in Licenses

Here's a new wrinkle in auto licenses, just put in force in New York state. Every applicant for a license to drive motor cars must pay a dollar. It is granted to any one who has driven a car as much as 1,000 miles, without further question. These licenses are renewable yearly at a cost of four bits. That will probably be the next wrinkle in other states.

Would Cost 22 Billions

The elimination of grade crossings would no doubt materially decrease the ominous total of fatal automobile accidents, but the cost in money would be stupendous. In 1922 the number of crossings eliminated totaled 706 at an expense of about \$70,000,000. As there are over 255,000 grade crossings in the country, an expenditure of twenty-two billions of dollars would, at this rate, be required to eliminate them all. An alternative is proposed in the formation of "Stop, Look, and Listen Clubs" among motorists. The Illinois Central supplies free to each member of these clubs a sign to be attached to his car, "This Car Stops at All Railroad Crossings." By April last these clubs numbered 25,000 persons along the line of the Illinois Central.
