

Timber Sent Across Pacific

Coos Bay exported 49,802,701 feet of timber to Japan the first eight months of this year. The next largest shipment was to Australia, which received 20,363,203 feet of logs and lumber and 68,000 pieces of lath.

China entered into Coos Bay business buying 8,217,465 feet of lumber and a sample shipment of 5410 feet of logs. South America took 4,117,345 feet of lumber.

The Japanese shipments were divided as follows: 17,480,499 feet of logs, 572,050 feet of poles, 31,555,199 feet of lumber and 194,044 feet of ties. Australia received 11,458,000 feet of logs and 8,895,203 feet of lumber.
