

Suicide's Effects Reveal Robbery

Between \$300 and \$400 worth of clothing and merchandise belonging to local stores was found last Sunday in the apartment of F. S. Baker, of Marshfield, who committed suicide Friday evening at the Deane apartments, in a search of his effects.

The goods were claimed by Rudolph Matson, of the Matson Clothing company, M. D. Bromberger and the Wilkinson store of North Bend, in which Baker had been employed for brief periods during the past summer. The discovery was a surprise and a shock to them, as Baker did not have the appearance of a wrong doer.—Times.

Could Not Compromise the Case

Assistant Attorney General J. M. Devers spent yesterday in Coos county attempting to effect a settlement between the highway commission and Mrs. McAdams over a piece of property used as right of way for the Coquille-Bandon road. The settlement was not made, the owner asking \$3000 for the property and the state being willing to pay only \$1000.
