Carter took them to the city jail, where today they are awaiting either their parents or some one from Philomath to take them back.—Times.

Escaped Prisoner Captured

Richard Lawhorne, escaped Coos county prisoner, has been apprehended in Reedsport by Deputy William Grubb and will be held there for Sheriff Ellingsen, according to word received Tuesday.

Lawhorne escaped about two weeks ago when he asked permission to go into the city to secure bail. He was accompanied by an officer but escaped as no one suspected that he would attempt to escape.

Lawhorne was downcast over his capture for he had just secured an offer to go to work at \$9 per day, according to the story told to officers. He has the larger part of his sentence remaining. He was sentenced to nine months in jail to pay \$1000 fine by the Powers justice.

Langlois Mill Gets Contract

O. P. Haagen's mill at Langlois has secured a contract to saw 100,000 feet of lumber for the construction of bridges and culverts on the link of the Roosevelt highway between Denmark and the Coos county line. Work of clearing right-of-way on the new route is now going forward but it is probable that grading will not start before weather settles in the spring.

Mr. Haagen says that the contract for bridge and culvert timber will keep his mill running fairly steadily for the next two or three months, after which time it will be sold to parties operating in northern Curry.—Port Orford Tribune.

NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT

On Beach street from a point 100 feet north of the north line of First street to a point 100 feet south of the south line of First street.

On Heath street from a point 100 feet north of the north line of First street to a point 200 feet south of the south line of First street.

On Coulter street from a point 100 feet north of the north line of First street to a point 500 feet south of the south line of First Street.

On Henry Street from a point 100 feet south of the south line of block 31 in Elliott's Addition, proceed east to a point 247.7 feet north of the said east extension of Block 31; thence northwesterly following the existing gulch to a connection with the proposed sewer in First Street.

On Elliott street from a point 70 feet south of the west extension of the south line of block 31 in Elliott's Addition to a connection with the proposed sewer in First street.

Sherwood street from a point 100 feet east of the east line of Elliott street to a connection with the proposed sewer in Elliott Street.

Elliott street from a point 200 feet north of the north line of First street to a connection with the proposed sewer of First street,
