"Chuck" Low was referee and it was a much cleaner game and more interesting to the fans than the one which preceded it—regarded strictly as a basketball game and not as an indoor football meet.

Brice Nosler, the fleet Myrtle Point forward, was too well brocked to permit his shooting many baskets, although he tried many from the middle of the floor. He made two field baskets, as did Ladd. Mast made one.

Art Pulford was the scoring machine for Coquille, dropping five through the hoop. Les Wilson followed with three and Bill Nosler, Gene Laird and Earl Rice made one apiece. Three out of eight free throws were successful. Myrtle Point's percentage was better, they making five of their eleven attempts.

The girls' game was won by Myrtle Point as nonchalantly as though the Coquille players were not showing a hundred per cent improvement over the first game played with Myrtle Point up there. Score 43 to 15.

As long as Lillian La Branche attends the Myrtle Point school, there is very little possibility that they will lose the girls' championship, which they have now won for three years.
