

**Booze vs. "Bucks"**

As the Sentinel this week has a contract to print some thousands of bills that are to be sold for one cent in real money for each unit of "bucks," as the stuff is called, it will be interesting to read what the Coos Bay Harbor tells of the way some boys at the Bay with lots of "bucks" and a big thirst did the Japs who had illicit liquor for sale there.

The story was told for the first time yesterday, but it is good enough to print, and then some. Not long ago a function was given at the Legion hall here when stage money was sold. After the affair was over several young men with inventive minds had large rolls of the money left, to say nothing of a big thirst.

Having heard that a Japanese steamer had slipped by the coast guard as they sometimes are said to do, with stores of liquor, good or bad, the boys thought they might pass off some of the stage money for liquor. "We'll try it, anyway," said they, and away they went to the dock in an automobile. Considerable doubt was expressed among the party of being able to fool a wily Japanese, but they could pass it off as a joke if the seller detected a fraud. The boys eased their consciences with the thought that it was illegal to sell liquor anyway and no crime to buy it in the manner they intended.

The scheme worked multiple percent better than they had dared hope, and the scout on the dock looking for business had "plenty for two dollar half a pint." Having \$10 bills, the boys bought pint after pint, three for each bill, expecting in the end they would have their liquor and \$2.50 besides in change.

They finally became ashamed at themselves and hadn't the heart to take any more. The agent, then, having no change, went aboard the vessel to bring back a pocketful. Going to the captain for change, the deceived man quickly learned what had happened to him, and waited for no further advice or information. Soon the boys saw the Japanese coming down the ladder frothing at the mouth with a cutlass about three feet long in his hand.

They waited no longer, but stepped on the gas and made their escape, leaving the change for future settlement.

A lawyer's man or Chapman was vouched for the truth of the tale, but said, "Mention no names."

Really it seems to us that the boys, who got booze for their "bucks," traded something that would do them no harm for something that might end their lives. Certainly they got the worst of that bargain.

**Plans Too Expensive**

Dougan & Hopalong, outside architects, who drafted plans for the Marshfield hotel company, estimated the building would cost the company \$325,000, but their estimate was \$75,000 under the lowest bid the company could obtain on the structure.

Seventy-eight thousand was only half of the under estimate which the architects made. The heating and plumbing and other accessories ran the bids up another \$75,000 more than the estimates. Finding the estimates so far off, the hotel stockholders and directors decided at once that the bids would have to be rejected and the size of the building reduced.—Coos Bay Times.
