Second Body Found

The body of Robert Frame, aged 16, the second victim of drowning when the skiff which they were occupying upset in South Slough more than a week ago, was found near the jetty Wednesday morning, half a mile below the Charleston bridge. The body of his half brother, Lester Jarf, aged 25, was found the day before on the mud flats about two miles above the bridge. The body of the Frame boy is believed to have been carried toward the ocean by the actions of the tide.

Both of the boys had set out early the morning of June 22 for a hunting trip at the head of the slough, intending the meet a companion. Failure to keep the appointment led to a search for the boys. Hope was abandoned last week that they would be found alive, as neither of the boys could swim.

The boys are sons of Mrs. John Frame, of South Slough, and in addition to relatives here have relatives in Finland. Mrs. Edward Beck of North Bend is an aunt of Lester Jarf. A double funeral was held for the drowning victims yesterday afternoon at two o'clock at the Therwachter undertaking parlors, with interment at Sunset cemetery.—Times.
