

Gorst May Get Contract

V. C. Gorst, of Gorst and King, returned last night from Los Angeles and San Francisco, where he sent in a bid for the government air mail service from Seattle to Los Angeles backed by his men and a number of others in the coast states. The result of the bid will be known within thirty days, Mr. Gorst said.

If successful, the planes will run on a regular schedule, probably leaving Seattle at 9:00 a. m., arriving at San Francisco 6:20 p. m.; leaving San Francisco at midnight and arriving at Los Angeles at 5:25 the next morning. The planes will carry mail, parcel post and express.—Coo Bay Times.

Killed a Big Buck

A 160-pound 4-point deer was shipped down on the Favorite Tuesday morning, killed by L. V. Woodard of The Dalles, one of a party of four who went hunting Monday in the green timber back of old camp 1 at the head of the south fork of Coos river. Others in the party were Clarence and Jennings Woodard, of The Dalles, and C. H. Woodard, of Coos river, whom they are visiting. They reported that they saw a black bear, but he saw them first, and clumsily, but speedily, scrambling over logs, eluded a useless patter of bullets and escaped.
