

# Notice of City Budget

Notice is hereby given that the Budget Committee of the City of Coquille, a municipal corporation of Coos County, Oregon, did, at a meeting of said Committee held on the 15th day of September, 1925, prepare a budget and estimate of the total amount of money proposed to be expended by said City of Coquille for the next ensuing fiscal year of said City for all purposes, and which said estimates were, on said date filed in the office of the City Recorder of said City; and that the Common Council of said City has held Monday, the 2nd day of November, 1925, at the hour of 8:30 o'clock P. M. as the time and the Council Chamber at the City Hall in said City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, as the place, at which such estimates may be discussed with the levying board of said City, with the Common Council of said City, at which said time and place any person who shall be subject to such tax levy when made, may be heard in favor of or against such tax levy or any part thereof.

**Random C. of C. Meeting**

There were 16 in attendance at the annual meeting of the Random Chapter of Commanders Tuesday evening, with visitors from Copella, North Bend and Marshfield. The banquet was held in the Hotel Westland.
