

**All Day Meeting at Arago**

Last Sunday the Arago people held an all day meeting in commemoration of the second anniversary of the organization of general church work in that community. This is not a federation nor a community church after the manner of most such organizations, but it is an association of Christians in a union work for advancing Christianity and for the upbuilding of the community in general. Six or eight denominations are represented, others of God's people have broken affiliations with all denominations and all work together as Christians. The leadership is entirely local and very efficient. We seldom find a church work which moves so smoothly and maintains a more generous spirit and brotherly love.

Sunday a threatened little disruption crossed through a lack of understanding of the Methodist Conference South. Not being acquainted with the fact that a local committee attends to the inviting of ministers to preach at Arago, they appointed one of their ministers to take charge of certain Sundays and arranged for a special meeting by a presiding elder upon the date of the special anniversary program. However, the misunderstanding was made known and settled in a quiet Christian manner, which would have done credit to an older and more experienced congregation. In order to have an early dinner and time for a full afternoon program, only Bible School was held. A special dinner was partaken of by about 200 people, 50 or so of whom were visiting brethren.

The afternoon program was very interesting. Short speeches by six ministers, several recitations, five songs, solos, duets, quartettes, and double quartettes were well chosen and exceptional in the rendering. The whole service was enjoyable and very inspirational.—Mrs. Maude MacDonell.
