Below is reproduced the wording which appeared on the parchment presented to the Beachmen, giving them authority over all the beaches in the realm:

Know All Men:
That on this day there appeared before the King a multitude headed by a body of "Boosters," calling themselves "Bandon Beachmen," making claims to certain rights and privileges and having demonstrated to the satisfaction of His Majesty, the King, and his court, that their claims were reasonable and just;
It is the order of the King and Court proclaimed to the people here assembled,
That the Bandon Beachmen be dubbed Knights of the Bath and Royal Goodfellows,
That they be made Over-lords of the Beaches of the Realm, with headquarters at "Bandon by the Sea."

And are bidden to go forth and Boost, carrying the word to other realms of the Beauty and Wonders of Bandon Beach, that the multitudes may hear, and come and enjoy its pleasures, and be thereby overcome with the desire to remain and also become Beachmen.
