Short Session of Council

Mayor Johnson, Councilmen Opperman, Fuhrman, Willey and Farr were those responding to roll call at the regular mid-monthly meeting of the city fathers Monday evening.

Very little business came up for consideration. The recorder and mayor were authorized to assign to C. A. DeLong the sheriff's deed which the city held to the former Al Crouch property in the north part of the city. Mr. DeLong, who had foreclosed a mortgage on the property, recently paid the \$675 the city had invested in it for street improvement, interest, penalty and taxes, and next spring his title will become absolute, without possibility of redemption.

The city attorney was instructed to prepare arguments to appear in the election pamphlet about December 1, in favor of the four measures which are to appear on the ballot at the election Dec. 21.

He was also authorized to represent the city at the hearing by the Public Service Commission in Marshfield, Dec. 2, when the Coos & Curry Telephone Company's application for a revaluation of their property comes

up. There will not be another session of the council until Monday, Dec. 7.
