Warren McGowan who teaches at Roy, has 31 school children. Esther Wilson teaches 31 pupils at Norway. Mary McKeele who teaches at Lee-ers has 28 pupils. Eula Richards teaches seven grades and has 27 pupils at Sumner. Virna Hermann who teaches seven grades at Coaledo has 29 pupils. Paloma Rendemann and Mirtel Felker teach 31 pupils at Powers.—Times.
