NOTICE OF ASSESSMENT

Portions of Front and Willard Streets

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 273 passed by the Common Council of the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, on the 4th day of January, 1926, and entitled: "An Ordinance levying and declaring an assessment against lots, parts of lots, and parcels of land benefitted by the improvement of portions of Front Street and Willard Street, directing the City Recorder to enter a statement thereof in the Docket of City Liens, and declaring an emergency," an assessment was levied and declared against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land benefitted by the improvement of Front Street from the west line of Willard Street to a point 568.1 feet west thereof and Willard

Street from the northerly line of Front Street extended westerly to a point 177 feet southerly thereof; thence south 62 degrees, 44 minutes west 115 feet, all as one improvement project, within the boundaries of the assessment district, which assessment district and the boundaries thereof are described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of lot 4 in block 4 of the original town of Coquille City as platted by T. B. Willard, and running thence west along the north line of lots 4, 5 and 6 in said block 4 to the northwest corner of said lot 6; thence in a southwesterly direction to a point on the west line of Willard Street, where the same is intersected by a line 100 feet northerly of and parallel to the north line of said Front Street; thence in a southwesterly direction 100 feet from and parallel to the northerly line of said Front Street 680 feet; thence southerly parallel to the west line of block 1 in said original plat of Coquille to the northerly line of the roadway to the Southern Pacific Company's depot; thence southerly to the intersection of the South line of Front Street with the easterly line of Ferry Street; thence southeasterly along the easterly line of Ferry Street; to the north line of the Southern Pacific Company's railroad right-of-way thence northeasterly along the said north line of said right of way to where the same intersects the easterly line of lot 3 in block 1 in the said original plat of Coquille City; thence northerly along the east line of said lot 3 and continuing across Front Street and on northerly along the easterly line of lot 4 in block 4 of said original plat to the place of beginning.

The whole cost of said improvement is the sum of \$6,973.77.
