Slot Machines Banned

District Attorney J. B. Beddingfield sends the Sentinel the following copy of a letter which he had sent to Sheriff W. W. Gage, regarding nickel-in-the-slot machines. Their use in the county must cease today.

"It has come to my attention that Nickel-in-the-slot machines are being displayed and operated in Coos county, without regard to the law and particularly that out of some twenty-three or twenty-four machines examined by your deputy, Mr. Anderson, only a few of them were supplied with merchandise, which they purport to vend, and that many of them were out of order so as to constitute an obvious gambling device.

"I believe that the courts will hold that any of the machines now being kept in the county, contain elements of chance when operated, and it is clear that these machines are not kept for the mere purpose of selling goods.

"These machines have been permitted to operate for a long period of time in this county and in order that there may be no unfair advantage taken of any business man who uses them I believe notice should be given to remove them before making arrests.

"On account of the foregoing facts, I request that you give notice at once to all persons concerned to remove nickel-in-the-slot machines from their places of business and if after Friday, the 22nd of this month there shall be found any such machine, displayed or used in vending goods, I request that you take the machines and arrest the person keeping, displaying or owning it."

No One Hurt in That Wreck

Another of those "wonder" accidents, in which no one is seriously hurt, occurred at the Bledsoe House corner on the highway a little before three o'clock last Saturday afternoon. Mrs. May Mast, her two years old son and Miss Mildred Laswell, were riding in the Tom Lawhorne Chevrolet roadster, going toward Marshfield. A fruit truck from Medford, driven by James Stewart, turned into the highway from Third street just ahead of them, and to avoid being struck, Mrs. Mast swerved sharply to the left and before she could swing back the roadster had crossed the sidewalk, broken the hand rail and turned over once or twice, coming to rest bottom side up, almost on the Bledsoe porch.

A cut on Miss Laswell's finger seems to have been the only injury any of them received, although they were badly shaken.

The roadster was pretty badly wrecked, with top and windshield, fenders and hood mashed, and otherwise it presented a dilapidated appearance when pulled out.

People who witnessed the accident say the truck was travelling altogether too fast in turning on to the highway.
