Specimens of the new currency to be used after July 10, 1929, are on display at the First National Bank here. The set of the new small size currency includes one silver certificate, \$1.00; one United States Note, \$2.00; one Federal Reserve Note, \$5.00; and one Federal Reserve Note, \$10.00.

The initial issue will include all kinds of currency except national bank notes, and all denominations from \$1.00 to \$20.00. The old currency will be retired gradually in regular course of business, and in the meantime its validity will not be affected by the issue of the new small size currency.
