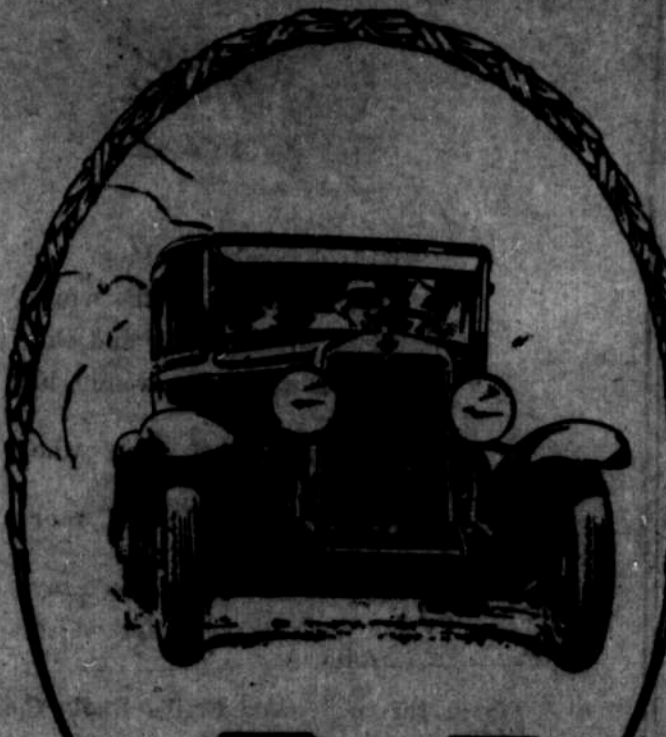

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

WATERWORKS IMPROVEMENTS

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the City Recorder, Coquille, Oregon, up to eight o'clock P. M. of Monday, the 26th day of August, 1929, for furnishing certain materials, labor, tools and equipment for the improvement of the Waterworks System in and for said City of Coquille, Oregon.

Separate bids will be considered as follows:

1. For furnishing approximately 9500 lin. ft. of 10-inch bell and spigot cast iron pipe, together with small quantities of other sizes and such special casting as are required, all F. O. B. car Coquille, Oregon.

2. For constructing certain improvements to the Waterworks System consisting of the hauling and placing of cast iron pipe and fittings, including necessary trench excavation and backfilling, furnishing and placing pipe line appurtenances, furnishing certain materials and building a control chamber at Bink Creek Dam, furnishing materials and improving local City Reservoirs, furnishing and placing flow meter, furnishing and placing chlorinator and furnishing other miscellaneous materials and labor, all as required by the plans and specifications.

All material and equipment shall be furnished and work done in accordance with plans and specifications on file at the office of the City Recorder, Co-

quille, Oregon, and at the office of Stevens & Roon, Consulting Engineers, Spalding Building, Portland, Oregon.

Facilities for examination of the plans and specifications will be provided at the offices of the City Recorder and the Consulting Engineers.

Prospective bidders desiring to secure a copy of the plans and specifications may obtain the same on application to the Consulting Engineers. Such application must be accompanied by a deposit of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars. One-half of the amount deposited will be refunded to the depositor who returns said plans and specifications in good condition within one week after bids are received. Any one securing the plans but returning the same in good condition at least seven (7) days before date bids are received will be refunded the whole amount of the deposit.

Specifications and proposal forms for pipe will on request be furnished to bona fide agents of manufacturers without deposit.

A certified check in a sum equal to not less than Five (5%) percent of the amount bid shall accompany each proposal.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids, waive technicalities and irregularities and accept any bid or to do any portion of the work by force account if it deems such action to be for the best interests of the City of Coquille.

NOTICE OF SALE OF WATER BONDS

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the Common Council of the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, until 5 o'clock P. M. August 26th, 1929, and thereafter, at 8 o'clock P. M. said bids will be opened and considered by the Council on said day at the Council Chambers, City Hall, Coquille, Oregon, for an issue in the total sum of \$40,000.00, Water Bonds, Series "F," under and by authority of a bond issue election held by the legal voters of said City August 5th, 1929. Said bonds will be issued in denominations of \$500.00 each, dated October 1st, 1929, and numbered 1 to 80, inclusive, of both numbers. Bonds numbered 1 to 3, inclusive, totaling \$1500.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1930; bonds numbered 4 to 14, inclusive, totaling \$5500.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1931; bonds numbered 15 to 26, inclusive, totaling \$6000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1932; bonds numbered 27 to 38, inclusive, totaling \$6000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1933; bonds numbered 39 to 52, inclusive, totaling \$7000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1934; bonds numbered 53 to 66, inclusive, totaling \$7000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1935; bonds numbered 67 to 80, inclusive, totaling \$7000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1936.

The said bonds will be issued and sold to secure funds to make certain improvements on the City water plant, as per specifications adopted by the Council August 12th, 1929, together with the redemption of certain outstanding warrants against the water funds of said City. Each bidder will be required to state the rate of interest, but not exceeding six per cent. The successful bidder will be required to furnish, at his own expense, suitably engraved bonds, and to bear the expense of any legal opinion required. Bids must be unconditional, except in case of illegality of proceedings, and must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of \$250.00 to be forfeited to said City, in case such bid shall be accepted and such bidder shall refuse to purchase said bonds, according to said bid. The

bonds numbered 27 to 38, inclusive, totaling \$6000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1931; bonds numbered 39 to 52, inclusive, totaling \$7000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1932; bonds numbered 53 to 66, inclusive, totaling \$7000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1933; bonds numbered 67 to 80, inclusive, totaling \$7000.00, with accrued interest, payable semi-annually from date of issue, will be payable January 1st, 1934.

The said bonds will be issued and sold to secure funds to make certain improvements on the City water plant, as per specifications adopted by the Council August 12th, 1929, together with the redemption of certain outstanding warrants against the water funds of said City. Each bidder will be required to state the rate of interest, but not exceeding six per cent. The successful bidder will be required to furnish, at his own expense, suitably engraved bonds, and to bear the expense of any legal opinion required. Bids must be unconditional, except in case of illegality of proceedings, and must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of \$250.00 to be forfeited to said City, in case such bid shall be accepted and such bidder shall refuse to purchase said bonds, according to said bid. The

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Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
