Another great shock came to McKinley community when the word was brought that Aldon Mast, familiarly known as "Jinks," had been almost instantly killed in camp near Powers. For The Construction of Sewers on Coulter Street, 11th Street, 8th Street and 7th Street, City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon

Notice is hereby given that upon the 19th day of August, 1929, there was filed in the office of the City Recorder, by said Recorder and the Committee on Streets of the Common Council of the City of Coquille, a proposed assessment for the cost and expense of constructing sewers on Coulter Street from 10th Street to 7th Street; on 11th Street from Holly Avenue to Heath Street; on Heath Street from 11th Street to 8th Street; on 8th Street from Heath Street to Coulter Street and on 7th Street from Center of Block 4, Nosler Addition to center line of Henry Street, all within the corporate limits of the City of Coquille as aforesaid.

WATERWORKS IMPROVEMENTS

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the City Recorder, Coquille, Oregon, up to eight o'clock P. M. of Monday, the 26th day of August, 1929, for furnishing certain materials, labor, tools and equipment for the improvement of the Waterworks System in and for said City of Coquille, Oregon.

Separate bids will be considered as follows:

1. For furnishing approximately 9500 lin. ft. of 10-inch bell and spigot cast iron pipe, together with small quantities of other sizes and such special casting as are required, all F. O. B. car Coquille, Oregon.

2. For constructing certain improvements to the Waterworks System consisting of the hauling and placing of cast iron pipe and fittings, including necessary trench excavation and backfilling, furnishing and placing pipe line appurtenances, furnishing certain materials and building a control chamber at Rink Creek Dam, furnishing materials and improving local City Reservoirs, furnishing and placing flow meter, furnishing and placing chlorinator and furnishing other miscellaneous materials and labor, all as required by the plans and specifications.

All material and equipment shall be furnished and work done in accordance with plans and specifications on file at the office of the City Recorder, Coquille, Oregon, and at the office of Stevens & Koon, Consulting Engineers, Spalding Building, Portland, Oregon.

Facilities for examination of the plans and specifications will be provided at the offices of the City Recorder and the Consulting Engineers.

Prospective bidders desiring to secure a copy of the plans and specifications may obtain the same on application to the Consulting Engineers. Such application must be accompanied by a deposit of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars. One-half of the amount deposited will be refunded to the depositor who returns said plans and specifications in good condition within one week after bids are received. Any one securing the plans but returning the same in good condition at least seven (7) days before date bids are received will be refunded the whole amount of the deposit.

A certified check in a sum equal to not less than Five (5%) percent of the amount bid shall accompany each proposal.
