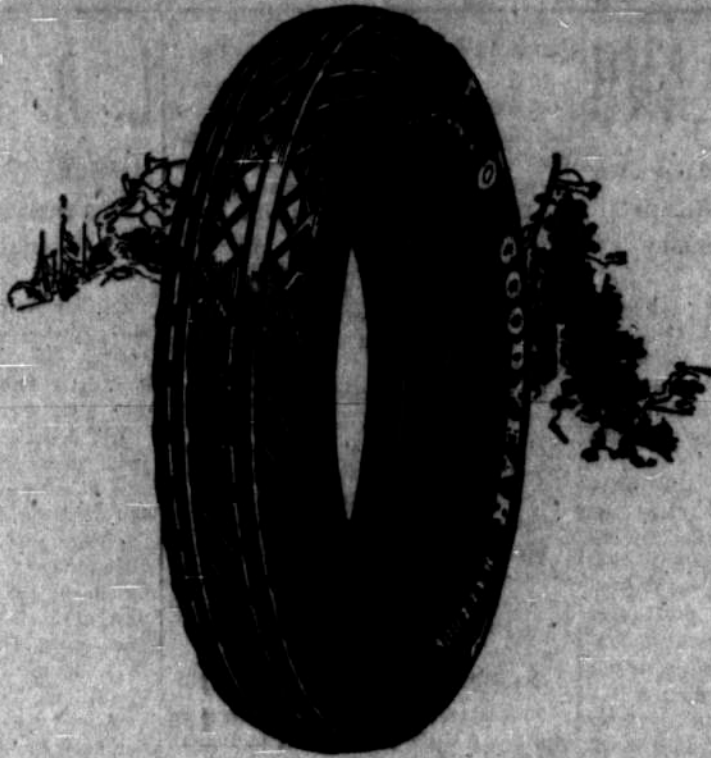

Water Supply Holds Out Well

Water Superintendent Epperson says the level of water back of the dam at the headwaters on Rink creek has dropped about twelve feet during the summer, but that it is not getting down to the danger point by a great many feet.

This is the driest summer in five years, and the city is fortunate in getting through it with so little water trouble.

As an indication of this year's water shortage, M. O. Hooton says that for the last four years he has had a thousand gallons a day from the small creek where he has a pump installed on his place north of the ball park, but that this year he gets about a thousand in three days.

The early rain usually comes about the 20th of August, but it has been delayed more than two weeks beyond that date this year.

There was quite a rainfall on Coos Bay Sunday morning but Coquille received no more than a light sprinkle.
