The center line of said pipe line is described as follows: Beginning at a point in the south line of said Southwest quarter of said Section 6, 980 feet west from southeast corner of said southwest quarter; thence North 45 degrees 01 minutes West, along located center line of said pipe line a distance of 501 feet to a point 358 feet north of Quarter Quarter Section corner on south boundary of said Southwest 1/4 of Section 6.

The center line of said pipe line is described as follows: Beginning at a point in the north line of said premises, 340 feet east of northwest corner of said premises, thence South 45 degrees 01 minutes East, along the located center line of said pipe line, a distance of 241 feet, thence southeasterly along the located center line of said pipe line on a curve to the left with a radius of 1433 feet through an angle of 36 degrees 55 minutes, a distance of 925 feet to a point in the east line of said premises, 680 feet south from the northeast corner of said premises.
