Wreck Injures 4 of 6 in Car

James Harley Smith, of Bridge, was released Tuesday under \$2000 bonds in Justice Stanley's court, where he was charged with reckless driving.

The accident occurred about midnight last Friday when he ran his brother's car, an Essex sedan, off the highway just this side of John Martin's house, a mile and a half west of town. The wheel marks show that he failed to follow the pavement and ran off where the paving curved. The car went down the 45 degree embankment, hit a fence about 20 feet below the highway, turned over once and from its appearance flopped back.

With him at the time were Robert Thompson and Tom Osmund, of Marshfield, and Rita and Lorene Clark, of Lee, whom the two boys were taking home from a dance in Marshfield. Joe Huff, of Myrtle Point, was with Smith when the boys asked him to take them to Myrtle Point.

All four of the young people were bruised but not seriously injured. Smith and Huff are reported to have left the scene of the wreck at once without doing anything to help the four injured.

It's a wonder there were no fatalities for all the glass on one side of the car, as well as the windshield was broken and the top was badly damaged. The car belonged to Smith's brother, T. W. Smith, of Bridge.
